<p>Poetry</p> <p>Find a poem to read! Read it a few times to practice reading with fluency. (You can find poems on our classroom website~Homework)</p>	<p>Raz Kids</p> <p>Go onto Raz-Kids. Listen to, read, and take a quiz for the book.</p>	<p>Math Fact Practice</p> <p>Practice your math facts on</p> 
<p>Researcher</p> <p>Go on Brain POP Jr. and learn about Thanksgiving, fall, reading maps, fossils, plot, character, setting, or internet safety. Show me what you learned by either completing a Make-a Map or write me a note about what you learned.</p>	<div data-bbox="597 653 1511 1325"> <p>Place Value Battle</p> <p>Skill: Forming the largest (or smallest) 3-digit number</p> <p>Players sit side by side (not face to face). Players take turns drawing a card and naming the "place" (ones, tens, hundreds) they are putting it in. Cards cannot be moved once placed. Players repeat until they have both formed a 3-digit number. The player with the largest (or smallest, depending on type of play) 3-digit number wins all cards. Play continues until all cards are used. Player with the most cards wins.</p> </div> 	
<p>Determined Artist!</p> <p>Illustrate a time when you showed determination.</p>	<p>Great Listening!</p> <p>Go onto an online reader (Storyline Online, Bookflix, Raz-Kids) and listen to a story. Chat about the story and share the most important details with someone.</p>	<p>Edgenuity (formally known as Compass Learning)</p> <p>Sign in to Edgenuity to complete an activity on your level.</p>
<p>Treasure Map</p> <p>Devise a treasure map that would lead someone to find the treasure. Try to include a compass rose and map key too!</p>	<p>Mail Time!</p> <p>Write a letter to someone in our school that you are thankful for and return your letter to school.
